



Zero Emissions Vehicles Ireland is being established to coordinate measures to support the uptake of zero emission vehicles and the rollout of world class charge point infrastructure.

The Climate Action Plan identifies the need for **945,000 low emissions vehicles in Ireland by 2030**. There are currently more than 60,000 electrical vehicles on the road.

Zero Emission Vehicles Ireland will build on activities to date in supporting the uptake in EV's and the roll-out of the required charging infrastructure to accelerate progress towards the 2030 targets and beyond...

20% of all GHG emissions in Ireland are transport related

51% reduction in transport emissions required by 2030



The mission of Zero Emission Vehicles Ireland is to support the uptake of zero emission vehicles and to coordinate the provision of charging infrastructure to meet the full range of needs for people and businesses across Ireland.

To achieve its mission Zero Emission Vehicles Ireland will collaborate closely with all related groups across government and the private sector, including SEAI, NTA, TII, and ESB Networks.

Fund research and innovation and create delivery focused stakeholder groups

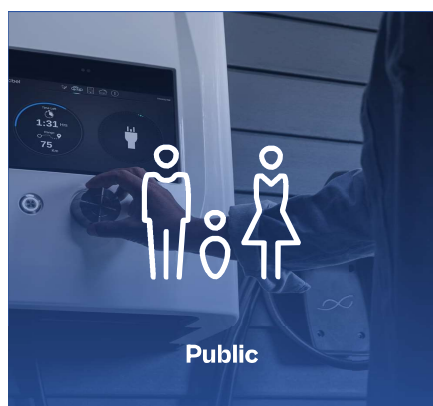
Infrastructure

Coordinate initiatives to deliver the required charging infrastructure for homes, neighbourhoods, en-route and at destinations

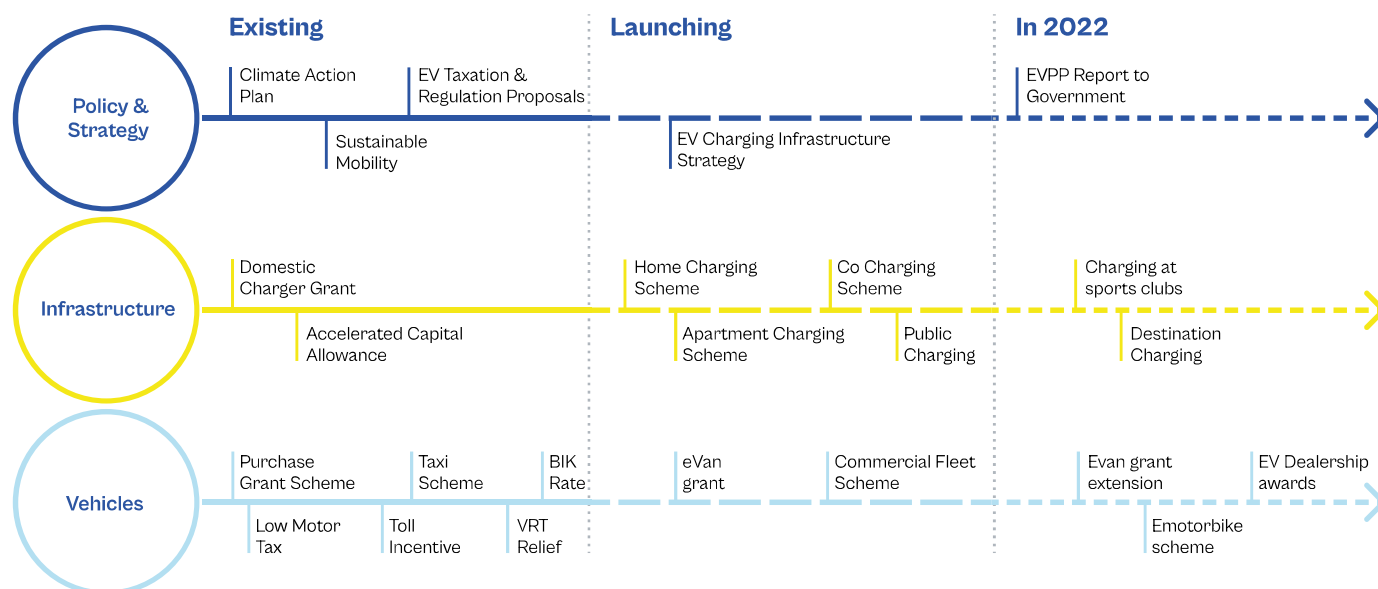
Vehicles
